Follow the Red Line Time

Many of America's most important historical moments occurred in Boston, and the city makes it easy for you to see them all through its <u>Freedom Trail</u>. The 2.5 mile path marked by a red line leads you to 16 spots that played a big role in the Revolution, including the site of the Boston Massacre, Paul Revere's house and the USS *Constitution* ("Old Ironsides").

Looking for more than Revolutionary history? Check out the Robert Gould Shaw and the 54th Regiment Memorial located across Beacon Street from the State House. The bas-relief honors one of the first African-American regiments of the Civil War, made famous by the acclaimed movie *Glory*. And, while following the Freedom Trail, don't miss Boston's most moving historical site — the New England Holocaust Memorial in Carmen Park on Congress Street. The interactive memorial offers a unique opportunity to reflect on the meaning of oppression, freedom and respect for human rights.

National Past Time

Love 'em or hate 'em, Boston sports teams are perennial winners. And though three of the four major sports teams are active at the moment, only one will be home during the RIMS conference. Fortunately, you'll have numerous chances to <u>catch the defending World Champion Red Sox</u> at historic <u>Fenway Park</u>, the oldest ballpark in Major League Baseball. The Bosox are in the midst of a homestand that runs through May 1.

Free Stuff Time

<u>RIMS exhibit hall activity</u> involves more than picking up a few tchotchkes for the kids (though who doesn't love to go "booth shopping?").
